


ON THE RIGHT TRACK

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) awarded \$19.6 million to the West Virginia Clinical and Translational Science Institute, a statewide consortium based at West Virginia University's Health Sciences Center. When combined with matching funds from other partners throughout the state — including private gift support — the scientists and clinicians leading this program will have access to \$53.1 million

over the next five years. The grant is part of the NIH Institutional Development Award Program for Clinical and Translational Research (IDeA-CTR).

Translational science targets real world health problems and rapidly translates that research into clinical practice, patient care and community based interventions that make a positive difference in people's lives.

The NIH is endorsing West Virginia and WVU as partners in the fight against the chronic illnesses which affect Appalachia most — cancer, stroke, heart disease and obesity. Solving these daunting health problems requires a team effort.

NEW HOPE FOR EYE DISEASES



Visvanathan Ramamurthy, PhD, researcher at the West Virginia University Eye Institute and the WVU Center for Neuroscience, and WVU MD/PhD student Cristy Ku recently demonstrated that gene replacement therapy restores sight in animal models with

leber congenital amaurosis (LCA). If successful in long-term studies, their research may create vision restoration options for childhood blindness patients.

Lee Wiley, MD, interim chair of the Eye Institute said, "This recent discovery by Dr. Ramamurthy's

vision research team provides new hope for vision restoration for those with LCA and will be a catalyst to finding better ways of treating other eye diseases."

This breakthrough in gene therapy will benefit treatment of other eye diseases as well.

HEALTHIER LIVING THROUGH HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

A BENEFICIAL LEGACY


For over 33 years, the late Dr. James P. Boland guided the Department of Surgery at WVU Health Sciences Charleston Division. Just before his passing in April 2011, his friends and colleagues in the medical community of Charleston created the “James P. Boland, MD, Department of Surgery Endowed Research Fund” in his honor.

Dr. Boland completed a cardiothoracic surgery fellowship at Parkland Hospital in Dallas in 1963. During his fellowship, he cared for Governor Connally who was shot during the assassination of President Kennedy, and he is listed in the Warren Commission report in this capacity.

He founded the surgical department and surgical residency program in Charleston.

This endowment, matched by the West Virginia Research Trust Fund, will offer surgical research support to a deserving faculty member and foster the education of future surgical residents and medical students. Though Dr. Boland is no longer with us, his dedication and commitment to research, teaching and service continue to benefit West Virginia through those faculty and students who follow in his footsteps.

“The fund is a great tribute to a man who helped countless people in his life. That is why we are donating to it,” said supporters Rick and Kathy Kimball.

A MODEL FOR IMPROVING RURAL HEALTH

The Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation funded a capacity building program that will develop short and long term strategies to improve the health status of the citizens of the Eastern Panhandle, especially elders. The goal of this \$130,000 grant

program is to create a model for improving rural health to be replicated elsewhere in West Virginia and the US. K. Joy Buck, PhD, RN, will lead the strategic planning process to complete data analysis, and develop programmatic priorities.

Laura Gibson, PhD, (*opposite page, in lab coat*) was installed as the first Alexander B. Osborn Distinguished Professor in Hematological Malignancies Research at the West Virginia University School of Medicine.

The Osborn professorship was made possible by a donation from the Alexander Bland Osborn Trust and a West Virginia Research Trust Fund match to create a \$1.57 million investment in the hematological malignancies program as well as the professorship.

Dr. Gibson's research focuses on the tumor microenvironment, influences on therapeutic response, and chemotherapy induced alterations of the marrow microenvironment as it relates to a patient's immune system recovery after transplantation. She and her colleagues in the Osborn Program collaborate in translational cancer research aimed at finding potentially useful drugs and novel treatments.

SEEING A BRIGHTER FUTURE



The West Virginia University Eye Institute received a \$70,000 gift from Glenmark Holding LLC to support glaucoma research. The donation established the Nesselroad Family Glaucoma Research Fund and was matched by the WV Research Trust Fund, making the total investment \$140,000.

“Glaucoma is the leading cause of preventable blindness in the United States. It typically has no symptoms until late in the disease when vision loss is

irreversible,” Judie Charlton, MD, glaucoma specialist and chief medical officer at WVU Healthcare, said. “These funds will help us find better ways to detect the disease early, particularly with the challenges we have as a rural state with an aging population.

“With three generations of known family members afflicted with glaucoma, it is our pleasure to support one of the top eye centers in the country,” Mark Nesselroad, CEO of Glenmark Holding LLC, said.

The Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation provided the West Virginia University Eye Institute a \$115,000 grant to assist the Appalachian Vision Outreach Program (AVOP), which works to improve local vision care to the most underserved and socio-economically isolated populations of West Virginia.

“Benedum’s support of the AVOP is critical to helping us meet the vision healthcare needs of West Virginians,” Lee Wiley, MD, interim chair of the Eye

Institute, said. “Thanks to their investment, we are able to partner with other organizations to provide services to restore vision and prevent blindness, giving many West Virginians opportunities for independence and employability.”

“It is sad to think people have to see eye care as a luxury because of their other financial needs when it is such an important component of healthy living,” Kim Barber Tieman, Benedum Foundation program

officer, said. “Benedum is pleased to collaborate with the AVOP and its partners to make accessible vision care available to West Virginians.”
